



2016 Lexus IS 200t

The IS is Lexus' entry-level luxury sport sedan available in base and F SPORT trim levels. The IS was totally redesigned for 2014 and is available with a 2.0-liter turbocharged 4-cylinder or 3.5-liter V-6 engine. 4-cylinder models come standard with rear-wheel drive, while V-6 models are available with rear-wheel or all-wheel drive. Depending on engine and drivetrain choice, a 6-speed or 8-speed automatic transmission is available.

Although the third-generation IS is well equipped for a sportier driving experience, the TLX offers a more complete blend of luxury and performance as well as more standard and available features.
